Notice of Preliminary Decision of the New York City Department of Environmental Protection.

In May 2026 the New York City Department of Environmental Protection initiated the following in connection with its Stream Management Program:

1. Through the Schoharie Basin Stream Management Program, the Greene County Soil and Water Conservation District entered into contract with Evergreen Mountain Contracting Inc. for construction of the Batavia Kill Restoration at Red Falls Project 4 in the Towns of Ashland and Prattsville at a cost that exceeds \$100,000.
2. Through the Schoharie Basin Stream Management Program, the Greene County Soil and Water Conservation District entered into contract with Evergreen Mountain Contracting Inc. for construction of the Manor Kill Streambank Restoration at Pangman Road in the Town of Conesville at a cost that exceeds \$100,000.
3. Through the Schoharie Basin Stream Management Program, the Greene County Soil and Water Conservation District entered into contract with the Greene County Highway Department for construction of the CR2 over Little West Kill culvert replacement in the Town of Prattsville at a cost that exceeds \$100,000.
4. Through the Rondout/Neversink Basin Stream Management Program, the Sullivan County Soil and Water Conservation District intend to enter into contract with the Town of Neversink Highway Department for the construction of a culvert replacement at Slater Road on the Chestnut Creek in the Town of Neversink at a cost that will exceed \$100,000.
5. Through the Rondout/Neversink Basin Stream Management Program, the Sullivan County Soil and Water Conservation District intend to enter into contract with the apparent lowest responsible bidder for the construction of a stream restoration project on the East Branch Neversink River at Riley Brook, located in the Town of Denning at a cost that will exceed \$100,000.
6. Through the Delaware Basin Stream Management Program, the Delaware County Soil and Water Conservation District intend to enter into contract with the apparent lowest responsible bidder for the construction of a stream restoration project on the Tremper Kill, in the Hamlet of Andes at a cost that will exceed \$100,000.

7. Through the Delaware Basin Stream Management Program, the Delaware County Soil and Water Conservation District intend to enter into contract with the apparent lowest responsible bidder for the construction of a stream restoration project on Liddle Brook, in the Hamlet of Andes at a cost that will exceed \$100,000.

This notice is being sent to the relevant parties to the New York City Watershed Memorandum of Agreement, consistent with the protocol established in paragraph 107(a) of said agreement.
